SPAIN, A GLOBAL HISTORY

From the late fifteenth to the nineteenth centuries, the Hispanic Monarchy was one of the largest and most diverse political communities known in history. At its apogee, it stretched from the Castilian plateau to the high peaks of the Andes; from the cosmopolitan cities of Seville, Naples, or Mexico City to Santa Fe and San Francisco; from Brussels to Buenos Aires and from Milan to Manila. During those centuries, Spain left its imprint across vast continents and distant oceans contributing in no minor way to the emergence of our globalised era. This was true not only in an economic sense-the Hispano-American silver peso transported across the Atlantic and the Pacific by the Spanish fleets was arguably the first global currency, thus facilitating the creation of a world economic system-but intellectually and artistically as well. The most extraordinary cultural exchanges took place in practically every corner of the Hispanic world, no matter how distant from the metropolis. At various times a descendant of the Aztec nobility was translating a Baroque play into Nahuatl to the delight of an Amerindian and mixed audience in the market of Tlatelolco; an Andalusian Dominican priest was writing the first Western grammar of the Chinese language in Fuzhou, a Chinese city that enjoyed a trade monopoly with the Spanish Philippines; a Franciscan friar was composing a piece of polyphonic music with lyrics in Quechua to be played in a church decorated with Moorish-style ceilings in a Peruvian valley; or a multi-ethnic team of Amerindian and Spanish naturalists was describing in Latin, Spanish and local vernacular languages thousands of medicinal plants, animals and minerals previously unknown to the West. And, most probably, at the same time that one of those exchanges were happening, the members of the School of Salamanca were laying the foundations of modern international law or formulating some of the first modern theories of price, value and money, Cervantes was writing *Don Quixote*, Velázquez was painting *Las Meninas*, or Goya was exposing both the dark and bright sides of the European Enlightenment. Actually, whenever we contemplate the galleries devoted to Velázquez, El Greco, Zurbarán, Murillo or Goya in the Prado Museum in Madrid; when we visit the National Palace in Mexico City, a mission in California, a Jesuit church in Rome or the Intramuros quarter in Manila; or when we hear Spanish being spoken in a myriad of accents in the streets of San Francisco, New Orleans or Manhattan we are experiencing some of the past and present fruits of an always vibrant and still expanding cultural community. As the reader can infer by now, this book is about how Spain and the larger Hispanic world have contributed to world history and in particular to the history of civilisation, not only at the zenith of the Hispanic Monarchy but throughout a much longer span of time.

FAVELA

FOUR DECADES OF LIVING ON THE EDGE IN RIO DE JANEIRO

Oxford University Press **Janice Perlman** wrote the first in-depth account of life in the favelas, a book hailed as one of the most important works in global urban studies in the last 30 years. Now, in *Favela*, Perlman carries that story forward to the present. SINNERS IN THE HANDS OF AN ANGRY GOD

Chapel Library Preached at Enfield, Connecticut on July 8, 1741, this is perhaps the greatest sermon ever preached in America—and is certainly among the most well known. Owing to its forthright dealing with God's wrath and His intense hatred of sin and the sinner, it is also one of the most controversial. Indeed, for more than three-quarters of the sermon Edwards lays down a relentless stream of the most vivid and horrifying descriptions of the danger facing unregenerate men. While it is difficult to read such graphic language, there is abundant hope in the sermon's conclusion. Edwards puts it this way, "And now you have an extraordinary opportunity, a day wherein Christ has thrown the door of mercy wide open and stands calling and crying with a loud voice to poor sinners." While those who would rather ignore God's justice in favor of His mercy condemn Edwards and his sermon, those who were present and actually heard him preach that day reacted in a decidedly different manner. According to the diary of Reverend Stephen Williams who attended the sermon, "Before the sermon was done there was a great moaning and crying through the whole House, 'what shall I do to be saved; oh, I am going to hell, etc.'" The diary goes on to indicate that Edwards had to interrupt his sermon and come down to minister to those who were under such awful conviction. And so, in spite of what the scoffers might think or say, "the amazing and astonishing power of God" was manifested among the people that day—with many falling not into the hands of an angry God, but into the arms of a mighty Savior.

Uno de los dos compadres alega haber encontrado el diario original del Descubridor del Nuevo Mundo, Cristóbal Colón; dicho autor describe las diferencias históricas con el diario original, en las versiones conocidas del Padre Bartolomé de las Casas y de Fernando Colón, las únicas copias históricas que sobreviven del diario original. En esta obra, se desarrolla muy bien el carácter del dictador, a través de todos sus trucos políticos para mantenerse en el poder, y la crueldad de sus acciones. Una parte muy importante de esta novela es la manera extravagante de la celebración de su boda. Por el otro lado, atestiguamos las luchas del héroe en contra de la dictadura; este personaje no está tan bien desarrollado como el personaje del dictador; pero se entiende claramente y es una parte muy significativa de esta novela. Un hecho trágico muy triste y lamentable es presenciar el éxodo de las nuevas generaciones causado por el estado de represión creado por el dictador. Otra parte interesante de esta obra es el fin apocalíptico de todas las malas influencias del tirano por medio de un gran tsunami. Toda la novela es una descripción de las luchas entre el bien y el mal. La perspectiva histórica se introduce a través del leitmotiv del manuscrito y por medio de dos importantes cometas que ocurrieron a principios del siglo XX. Finalmente, la novela cierra con un epílogo, en el cual los dos compadres hacen un escrutinio de todos los libros publicados durante la época de la dictadura.
